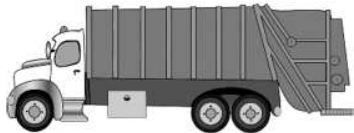
Citywide Spring Cleanup – April 29

Spring cleanup of bulk items will be held on Wednesday, April 29, 2020. All items must be to the curb by 7:00 AM. Items that **will** be collected include furniture, non-freon containing appliances, carpeting, padding, mattresses, box springs, treadmills and other large household items. Each resident is limited to four cubic yards (roughly 16, 96-gallon carts).

Items that will NOT be collected are:

- Construction Materials (Shingles, etc.)
- Household Chemicals
- Paint, Oil & Other Liquids
- Freon Containing Appliances
- TVs and Other Electronics
- Yard Waste
- Tires

Please note, if your items were out by 7:00 AM and are not collected Wednesday, April 29, please leave them at the curb for collection later in the week. Streets will not be revisited if already collected.

2020 Dog License Deadline

Dog licenses are renewed at the beginning of each year and expire at the end of each year. **If the dog license is renewed after March 31, there will be a \$5.00 late fee per dog license.** A copy of the rabies certificate must accompany the dog license application for each dog.

Census 2020

Every 10 years the U.S. conducts a census to count the population in all 50 states, the District of Columbia and five U.S. territories.

Participating in the census is required by law, even if you recently completed another survey from the Census Bureau. A complete and accurate count is critical for you and your community, because the results of the 2020 Census will affect community funding, congressional representation, and more.

By April 1, every home will receive an invitation to participate in the 2020 Census. **You will have three options for responding: by mail, by phone or online.**

Please note you will **never** be asked for: your Social Security number, money/donations, anything on behalf of a political party or banking/credit info.
