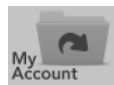

Lodi Utilities - MyAccount

MyAccount is up and running and has been a huge success. There are many benefits to using my account and signing up is easy. New users will need the name on their utility account, account number and an email address. Simply go to www.lodiutilities.org and click on the MyAccount Icon.



- **Registered Users:** MyAccount allows review of monthly statements and now has 639 users.
- **Paperless Billing:** 109 residents have signed up for paperless billing, saving resources and clutter. Those that sign up receive an email notification and can view their bill online.
- **AutoPay:** 538 utility customers are now signed up for autopay. Customers may sign up on MyAccount for monthly autopay through their bank account. There is no monthly fee and this ensures your payment is on time.
- **AutoPay by Credit Card:** 41 utility customers have signed up for monthly auto pay on their credit cards. Payments made this way are subject to a \$3.25 fee for each \$300 transaction.

Property Assessment - Open Book and Board of Review

Each municipality in Wisconsin must hold an Open Book and Board of Review (BOR) session. These sessions allow property owners to review and appeal the assessment of real property and personal property.

The City of Lodi Assessor, Milde Appraisal Services LLC, will be holding Open Book at City Hall on Tuesday, May 18, from 3:00 PM – 6:00 PM. Scheduling details will be posted on the City's website.

If, after the Open Book session, you wish to object to the assessment, you will need to file a written or oral intent to object with the City Clerk a minimum of 48 hours prior to the Board of Review. The Board of Review will meet at Lodi City Hall Wednesday, June 2, from 3:00 PM to 5:00 PM.

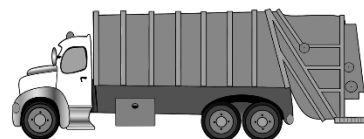
Citywide Spring Cleanup - June 16

Spring cleanup of bulk items will be held on Wednesday, June 16, 2021. All items must be to the curb by 7:00 AM. Items that **will** be collected include furniture, non-freon containing appliances, carpeting, padding, mattresses, box springs, treadmills and other large household items. Each resident is limited to four cubic yards (roughly 16, 96-gallon carts).

Items that will NOT be collected are:

- Construction Materials (Shingles, etc.)
- Household Chemicals
- Paint, Oil & Other Liquids
- Freon Containing Appliances
- TVs and Other Electronics
- Yard Waste
- Tires

Please note, if your items were out by 7:00 AM and are not collected Wednesday, June 16, please leave them at the curb for collection later in the week. Streets will not be revisited if already collected.



Are you Receiving the Lottery & Gaming Credit on Your Tax Bill?

The Lottery and Gaming Credit is a credit that provides direct relief to qualifying taxpayers on their property tax bills. To qualify for the credit, you must be a Wisconsin resident, own a dwelling and use it as your primary residence, and reside at that property as of the January 1 certification date of the year the property taxes are levied.

Please check your 2020 tax bill to assure you are receiving this credit. Tax bills are available at www.co.columbia.wi.us. If you do not have a Lottery & Gaming credit, you must file an application with the county treasurer in order to receive it in 2021. The application can be found at www.revenue.wi.gov/Pages/Form/lottery-home.aspx.

Summer Pool Positions Available

Outdoor Burning

Please remember that outdoor burning in the City of Lodi is limited to the burning of clean wood **only**. The burning of leaves, brush, garbage, etc. is prohibited. Leaves and small sticks may be taken to the city compost pile on Highway K.

Grass Clippings

Do not blow your grass clippings into the street, as they can travel into the storm sewer system which leads to creeks and streams. Instead, try blowing grass clippings back onto your lawn to help with natural fertilization. Grass clippings can also be composted by taking them to the City of Lodi compost site found on Highway K.



Brush Pick Up

The City of Lodi picks up brush every Monday for most of the year. Weather and other factors may affect brush chipping. If the chipping crew does not finish on Monday, please leave your items at the curb and the crew will be back to finish the job when possible.

- The wood chipper can take limbs up to 6 inches in diameter and long enough so only one person is needed to pull it from the curb to the chipper safely. Any limbs over six inches in diameter will be the property owner's responsibility to dispose of.
- Brush and limbs **MUST** be placed at the curb with the cut end toward the curb and stacked in a neat and orderly fashion. Larger limbs should be grouped together and placed separately from the smaller brush piles.
- Brush piles that are mixed or thrown every which way will not be picked up until they are piled correctly.
- Avoid conflicts with trees, poles, hydrants, mailboxes, parked cars and other obstructions.
- Remove all roots, dirt and metal. Roots and dirt will **NOT** be accepted!
- Collection is for tree trimmings and shrubs only. Brush and other solid waste shall not be mixed.
- No yard or food waste will be accepted. Please take these items to the compost site on County Road K.
- Brush collection is intended as a convenience to property owners in the City of Lodi and not as a supportive service for land clearing activities.
